- 4. Nashik The Sacred Land of Ramayana

 - Significance: Linked to Lord Rama's exile, Nashik's KumbhMela is centered around the Godavari River, considered the Ganga of the South.

- Sustainability: Strengthening green initiatives such as waste management, renewable energy, and water conservation will reduce environmental damage.
- Digital Expansion: Leveraging AI, big data, and multilingual digital platforms can enhance global reach and operational efficiency.
