Before this repertory desire and aversion related rubrics are present in chapters of repertory of Anti Psoric, BTPB but no separate repertory for this area. This repertory is a source book of Lippe's repertory, Kent's repertory and also other general types of repertory.

About Author:

William Jefferson Guernsey (2/15/1854- 3/27/1935). W.J. Guernsey was born in Frankford, Philadelphia (Pennsylvania) in 1854. He was son of William Fuller Guernsey, M.D., and Adilene R. Eastman, his Wife. In 1875 he graduated M.D. from Hahnemann Medical College, Philadelphia. He was strict follower of Principles of Homoeopathy laid down by Dr. Hahnemann. In 1897 he conceived the idea of combining predigested meat with concentrated malt as a food for invalids and infants, and placed upon the market, in small way a Preparation containing the best peptones and malt then Obtainable. Dr. Guernsey married, in 1878, Marrion M. Morgan, by whom he has two daughters, Grace K. and Helen R. Guernsey.

Desires and aversions is a strong physical general symptoms which to help the formation of totality and reach the similimum. The importance of desires and aversions in Homoeopathic prescription is immense.

About The book:

This book has 2 main subdivisions: 1. List of Remedies. 2. Repertory part.

1. List of Remedies:

It has total 231 remedies. It gives the abbreviated names and full names of the remedies given in the repertory. First remedy is Abies canandensis and last remedy is Zizia aurea. Style of abbreviated from is for example Allium cepa – All-c.

2. Repertory part:

It has two parts, one is Desire For and another is Aversion To. In this repertory typography are eight grades which are follows-

Cross reference is given in 2 ways:

DESIRE For:

This section has 141 rubrics. This part contains total 18 number pages. The serial number is given, followed by the rubrics. General rubrics are given in bold capitals, followed by the remedies. The rubrics are given in alphabetic order from **Acids** and last **wine**. Eg. **25. CAKES: Plb.** Sub rubric is given below the main rubric, with indentation and followed by a "-". Eq -56. FISH: (Nat-m)

The rubrics are given in alphabetic order from **Acids** and last **wine**. Sub rubric is given below the main rubric, with indentation and followed by a "--". Eg -165. EAT: BREAKFAST.

FOOD Rubric contains highest number medicines.

Discussion:

This repertory is a source book of Kent's repertory and also various pre & post-Kentian general repertories. Number of rubrics and medicine are less present in this repertory. Rubrics of Desires and Aversions are present in various Repertory before and after this Repertory are as follows-

In Boenninghausen's Repertory of Anti-psoric, rubrics Desire & Aversion come under the chapter Appetite.

In Boenninghausen's Therapeutic Pocket Book, rubrics Desire & Aversion come under the chapter Hunger & Thirst.

In Lippe's repertory to the more characteristic symptoms of Materia Medica, rubrics Desire & Aversion come under the chapter Appetite and thirst, hunger and thirst.

In Kent's Repertory, rubrics Desire & Aversion come under chapter Stomach.

In BBCR, rubrics Desire & Aversion come under the chapter Appetite.

In Boricke's Repertory, rubrics craving & Aversion come under chapter Stomach.

In Phatak's repertory, as rubrics Desire & Aversion are presents.

In Synthitic repertory, Sub-rubrics Desire & Aversion come under the FOOD& DRINKS Rubrics of volume-II: General symptoms.

In Synthesis Repertory, rubrics Desire & Aversion come under the chapter Generals.

In Murphy's Repertory, rubrics Desire & Aversion come under the chapter Food.

Merits:

In this 2006 edition of "A Repertory of Desires and Aversions" a very good attempt has been made: 1.To makes it more users amicable.

- 2. Abbreviations and names of medicines have been measured according to Synthesis in the whole text.
- 3. Readable font has been introduced with increased font size of every rubric.

Conclusion:

Only desires and aversions we can't reach the similimum, but it clue the pathway for formation of the totality & selection of the similimum. To form the totality, mental general symptoms, physical general and

then particular symptoms are to be taken into consideration as per hierarchy or as per the intensity and frequency of symptoms. But only strong peculiar desires & aversion can cure the case, but no prescription can be based upon single symptom & the totality of the symptoms must be done for the correct selection of the remedy.
