Abnormal leukorrhea can be caused by bacterial, yeast, or other microbial infections. Sexually transmitted diseases like gonorrhoea and chlamydia are common causes of leukorrhea as they infect the cervix and irritate its mucus glands leading to excessive mucus production mixed with pus. Vaginitis (inflammation of the vagina) is also a common cause of leukorrhea and can be caused by infections with *Candida albicans* fungus or *Trichomonas vaginalis* parasite. These infections can result in persistent and bothersome discharge that is difficult to treat.[1]

**Causes:** Leucorrhoea, a common condition, can be caused by various factors including pregnancy, menstruation or congestion of the uterus. Infections of the female reproductive organs, irritation from mechanical factors like chemical contraceptives or intrauterine devices, emotional triggers such as stress and anxiety, hormonal imbalances, dietary errors and excessive use of stimulants like tea, coffee, alcohol and smoking can also contribute to this condition. ### Types:

**1. Physiologic:** This type is considered normal and is caused by hormonal changes. It is commonly seen in early pregnancy, during moments of sexual arousal, as a sign of puberty in young girls, and in newborns up to one week after birth due to exposure to maternal estrogens.

**2. Inflammatory or pathological:** In this case, the discharge may be yellow and have an unpleasant odour. It can be caused by various infections and requires medical attention. The following are some possible causes for this condition:

- **Cervicitis:** Lower back pain is a common symptom of this inflammation of the uterine cervix, usually caused by an STD, allergic reaction to IUDs (intra-uterine devices used as contraceptives), or a reaction to contraceptive products such as ointment, jelly, or condoms.

- **Vaginal yeast infection:** Also known as candidiasis, this condition is often seen in women with diabetes, during pregnancy, while taking antibiotics or birth control pills. An imbalance in the pH level of the vagina can lead to a yeast infection. Poor hygiene practices such as wearing dirty or damp undergarments can also contribute to its development.

- **Trichomonal Vaginitis:** This condition is characterized by a frothy yellow discharge and itching. Possible causes include STDs, using unsanitary sanitary towels, or wearing dirty undergarments. Symptoms usually appear 3 to 28 days after infection.[3]

### - Symptoms and impact

A thick, pale or yellowish fluid

Discomfort in the lower stomach

Painful genital area

Severe irritation of the vaginal area

A burning feeling during urination and frequent need to urinate small amounts

Trouble with digestion, such as constipation

Fatigue caused by loss of important fluids from discharges

Foul odour or foamy discharge [4]

### III. CONVENTIONAL TREATMENTS

The presence of sexually transmitted diseases can lead to leukorrhea, so addressing the STD can also address leukorrhea. The use of antibiotics, like metronidazole, may be recommended for treatment. Other typical antibiotics used to treat STIs are clindamycin and tinidazole.[5]

Diet is crucial for leucorrhoea patients, but it's important to know which foods to consume and avoid. Eating the wrong foods can have a negative impact on your health. Here are some guidelines for grains, fruits, vegetables, lentils, non-vegetarian items, spices, and beverages that are recommended or should be avoided for those with leucorrhoea.

Grains to consume and avoid:

- Consume: brown rice, barley, buckwheat, dry oats, wheat bran, millet
- Avoid: bread (with yeast), pancakes, pasta

Fruits to consume and avoid:

- Consume: apples, pears, peaches, raisins, apricots, pomegranates, black plums, cranberries
- Avoid: pineapples, papaya, oranges, lemon, tamarind banana, y avocado kiwi watermelon plums dates coconut

Vegetables to consume and avoid:

- Consume: okra, mushrooms green beans peas celery cilantro corn broccoli cabbage carrots cauliflower garlic eggplant bitter melons turnips
- Avoid: potatoes sweet potatoes pumpkin tomatoes zucchini

Lentils to consume and avoid:

- Consume: kidney beans soybeans soy cheese soy flour soy powder soy sauce tofu (cold)
- Avoid: black beans black-eyed peas chickpeas

Non-vegetarian items to consume and avoid:

- No non-veg item is recommended
- Avoid: eggs meat bread sweets alcohol fried foods black coffee tea

Spices to consume and avoid:

- Consume: ajwain almond extract asafoetida (hing) basil bay leaf black pepper cardamom
- Avoid: salt

Beverages to consume and avoid:

- Consume: fresh vegetable juices advised fruit juices
- Avoid : chocolate milk coffee cold dairy drinks grapefruit juice iced tea icy cold drinks lemonade orange juice papaya juice[13]

Relaxation Techniques: Nisphanda Bhava, Anitya Bhavana, Shavasana

A dyscrasia refers to a generalized health impairment, and recognizing the character of the discharge—ranging from thick and yellowish in tubercular patients to odourless in psora—is critical for diagnosis. Leucorrhoea related to tuberculosis often appears thick, creamy, or greenish-yellow and may have a sweetish odour. Psora-related discharge is typically white and bland. Pseudo-psora produces purulent discharge, while sycosis causes thin, acrid, and potentially foul-smelling discharge. Management for tubercular leucorrhoea includes a nourishing diet, ample fresh air, exercise, and bathing to restore health. It is characterized by significant systemic drain linked to blood changes and red blood cell death. In contrast, true psychotic conditions do not exhibit the same blood changes, though pseudo-psora and sycopsora can lead to cachexia. Treatment should be tailored to the specific miasm, with particular care in prescribing vaginal douches to avoid tissue irritation. Dietary recommendations include raw eggs and olive oil to enhance nutrient intake, along with limiting potatoes and meats to boost fat intake, which is vital for rebuilding strength in patients with these conditions. ### - Key remedies:

- **Alumina:** Leucorrhoea is characterized by a sharp, abundant discharge that is clear and stringy, accompanied by a burning feeling. The symptoms are more severe during the day and following menstruation, but can be alleviated by rinsing with cold water.
- **Borax:** This natural remedy is effective in treating a large and protein-rich discharge condition known as leucorrhoea.
- **Calcarea Carbonica:** Leucorrhoea, a condition characterized by a thick and milky discharge, can cause burning and itching sensations in the affected areas before and after menstruation. It may also be present in young girls and can be accompanied by heightened sexual desire. Symptoms tend to worsen before the onset of menses.
- **Graphites:** Pale, thin, and abundant white discharge, accompanied by back pain and weakness. Constipation is also present. Strong reluctance toward coition.
- **Kreosotum:** Yellow discharge, with a pungent smell resembling that of green corn, is a symptom of leucorrhoea. This condition tends to worsen in the time between menstrual cycles. The flow itself is harsh and can cause discomfort through its corrosive nature, leading to itching in the vaginal area, as well as burning and swelling of the labia. Both internal and external parts may experience a burning sensation and soreness. Additionally, there may be bleeding after coition. In cases of leucorrhoea, the lochia (postpartum discharge) can also have a strong and unpleasant odour.
- **Lilium Tigrinum:** Leucorrhoea, which is characterized by an acrid and brown discharge, stops when the body is at rest. The labia may experience a stinging sensation and there may be a feeling of pressure and urgency to have a bowel movement, as if all organs are about to come out. There is also a persistent need to physically hold the affected areas.
- **Mercurius:** A sharp-smelling discharge, accompanied by a sensation of heat and enlargement in the vaginal or outer genital area. This natural remedy is effective for treating greenish-yellow discharge, especially when it worsens at night.
- **Natrum Muriaticum:** Leucorrhoea is characterized by a foul, sharp and fluid discharge. The sensation of pressure and discomfort intensifies in the morning. There is a lack of sexual desire caused by dryness in the genital area.
- **Pulsatilla.:** The discharge, known as Leucorrhoea, is sharp, fiery and thick. The patient experiences exhaustion and discomfort in their back. This may be caused by damp feet, weakened nerves or anaemia. Seeking fresh air improves their condition.
- **Sabina:** Following menstruation, the presence of Leucorrhoea and discharge can be unpleasant and damaging. Bleeding occurring outside of the normal menstrual cycle can also be accompanied by sexual arousal. Leucorrhoea can also cause a heightened sexual drive. Pain may spread from the lower back to the pubic region and then travel upwards through the vaginal canal. [7]

**Cubeba Officinalis Q, 2X** can be used to treat leucorrhoea in young girls.

**Ova Tosta Q** is helpful for leucorrhoea that causes persistent back pain.

**Virburnum opulus and viburnum prunifolium Q** are especially useful for those who have a history of frequent miscarriages or painful menstruation.

Initially, the burning sensation during urination was relieved and the Leucorrhoea became milder with a decrease in discharge. After two months of treatment, the patient was completely cured of Leucorrhoea. In summary, Sepia 200 proved to be an effective treatment for this patient's Leucorrhoea by targeting her specific symptoms.[9]
