Spirituality, which comes from the Latin, spirits, meaning "breath of life," is a way of being and experiencing that comes about through awareness of a transcendent dimension and that is characterized by certain identifiable values in regard to self, others, nature, life, and whatever one considers to be the Ultimate (Elkins et al.,1988). Spirituality will

refer to an individual's search for or sense of connection with the sacred, supernatural, or ultimate reality (King et al. 2020).

Morality is a complex and multifaceted concept that pertains to the principles, values, and judgments that guide human behavior in terms of distinguishing right from wrong many researchers have focused on the study of morality. It is important to note that **Kohlberg (1981)** developed an influential theory of moral development that categorized people's moral reasoning strategies into three levels—preconvention, conventional, and post conventional—with two stages in each level. According to Kohlberg, moral maturity is marked by increasing degrees of reasoning as people progress through the phases.. Criticisms to this theory include the overemphasis on justice, exclusion of other important values such as caring, and minimal consideration of gender and culture (**Crain, 1985; Gilligan, 1982**). **Turiel (1983)** used Kohlberg's assumptions to create the widely cited definition of morality as “prescriptive judgments of justice, rights, and welfare pertaining to how people ought to relate to each other”. The following describes moral reasoning as “conscious mental activity that consists of transforming given information about people (and situations) in order to reach a moral judgment” (**Haidt, 2001**). Morality is often used interchangeably with ethics, but there is a subtle distinction between them: Although morality describes beliefs and choices about appropriate behavior, ethics is concerned with principles that explain moral choices (**Deigh, 1995**).

## 2. OBJECTIVE

We set out to conduct a thorough literature study in order to provide answers to the following research topics from a spiritual and moral standpoint:

- Examine the conceptual connection between morality and spirituality.
- Examine the empirical data that shows how morality and spirituality are related.

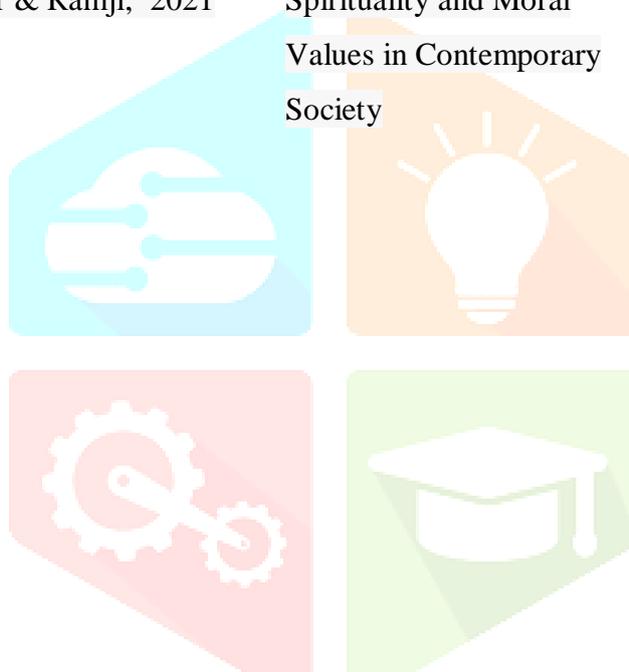
## 5. ANALYSIS

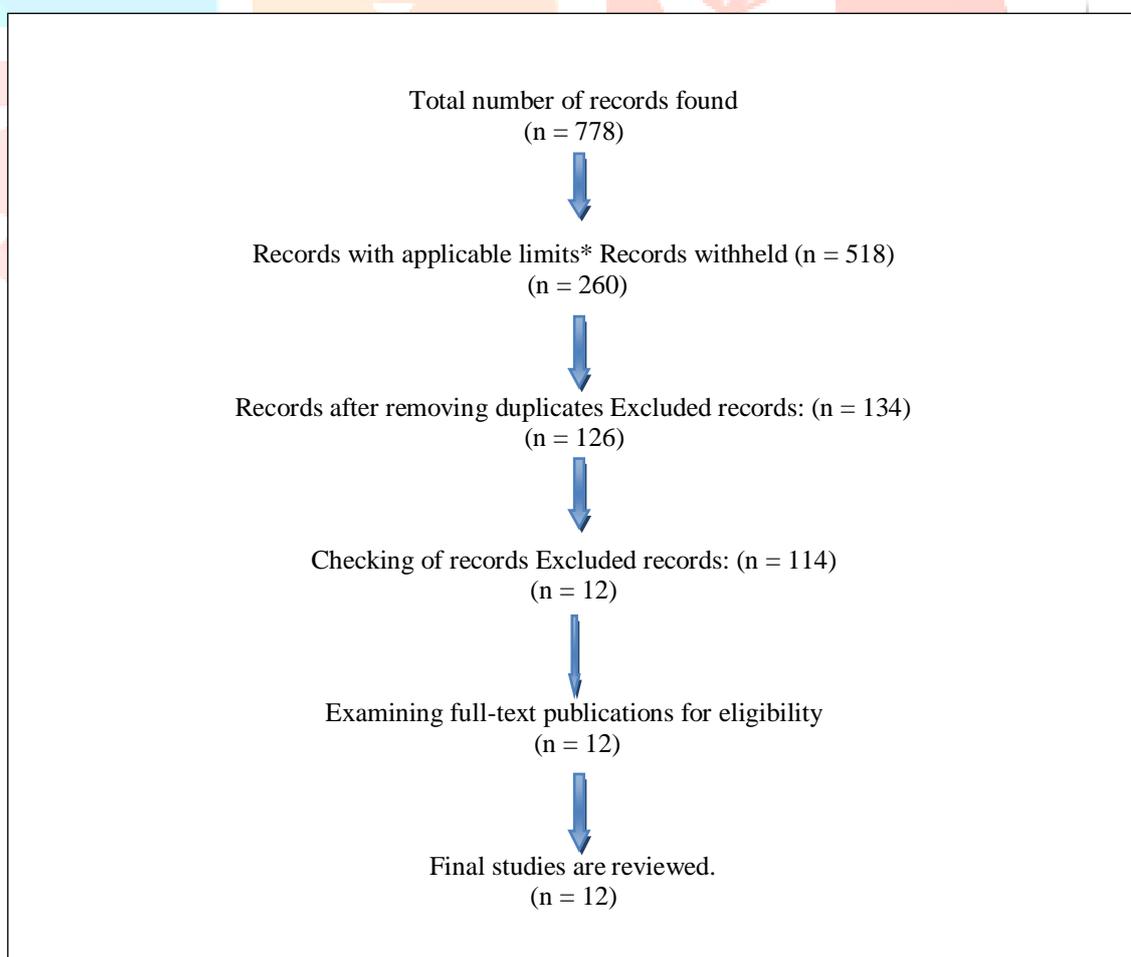
