


Q1. How satisfied were you with the overall experience of Hampi Utsav?


Q2. How would you rate the quality of cultural performances?


Q3. How satisfied were you with the cleanliness and hygiene at the festival?


Q4. How enjoyable was the cultural experience of Hampi Utsav?


Q5. How likely are you to attend Hampi Utsav again in the future?


Q6. How often do you visit cultural festivals like Hampi Utsav?


Q7. How engaged were you with the activities and performances at the festival?


Q8. The festival met my expectations.


Q9. How would you rate the accessibility and transportation to the festival?


Q10. The availability of food and beverages met my expectations


Q11. How satisfied were you with the security arrangements at the event?


Q12. The signage and directions at the festival were clear and helpful.


Q13. The festival contributes positively to local businesses and the economy.


Q14. Hampi Utsav helped me learn more about the cultural and historical significance of Hampi.
