LITERATURE REVIEW

This shift challenges traditional Participatory Design by engaging stakeholders in the design process. (Bjögvinsson et al., 2012)

The visual-centric nature of platforms such as Pinterest and Instagram has fostered a "trend economy," where designers not only consume but also contribute to global design conversations (Kaplan & Haenlein, 2010). However, studies also point out the potential pitfalls of over-reliance on social media for design inspiration, such as the homogenization of styles and the loss of regional uniqueness (Braga, 2023).

Gregionalization, or the integration of global and influences, is gaining popularity in the design world, notably in graphic design, when global trends adapt to conditions (Robertson, 2012). Recent study on gization in creative sectors reveals that designers frequently alter global concepts to meet the cultural and aesthetic demands of all audiences. This technique enables designers to stay connected to global trends while keeping their regional identities. (Neville, 2019)

Researchers have discovered that designers are increasingly using glocalization tactics in environmental graphic design, especially in urban environments where global trends frequently clash with regional customs. (Wathen, 2020)

Despite the growing body of research on social media's influence on design and glocalization, there is limited scholarly work specifically addressing how these forces interact within the field of graphic design. While studies have explored social media's broader impact on visual design (Brydges & Sjöholm, 2019), Few highlight how these tendencies are modified for environmental contexts, where aspects like dynamics of space and user experience serve crucial roles. Globalization's application in graphic design is underexplored, but understanding how designers balance global influences with regional needs could enhance our understanding of the evolving design landscape.

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

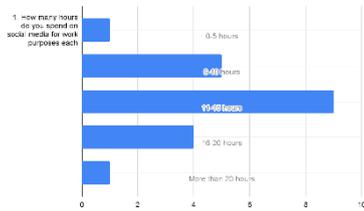

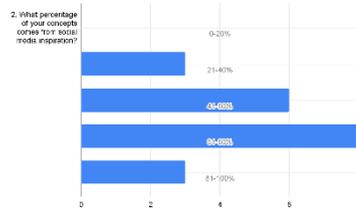

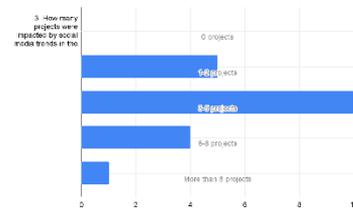

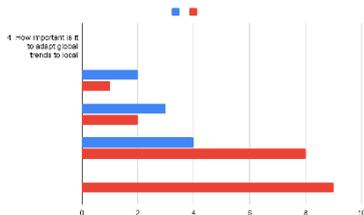

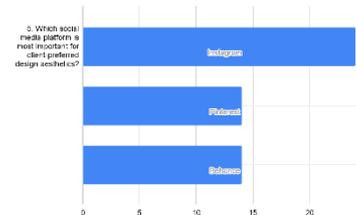
